



### TARANAKI DISCOVERER

#### **WED 06 Home - New Plymouth**

Departing Kapiti Coast, we travel along the west coast of the North Island before passing through Whanganui. Here we continue our journey north as we reach the start of the Surf Highway 45, passing through the "Bread Capital" Manaia, before we stop at Opunake and allow time for a lunch stop (own cost).

The surf coast that gives the highway its name leads to dozens of surf breaks including the 'Kumera Patch', 'Stent Road' and 'Rocky Rights'. We will stop for a stretch and sea air at the small coastal town of Oakura with its eclectic mix of stress-free baches, million-dollar beach houses and a wide black-sand beach before reaching New Plymouth. Tonight, we dine together in the centrally located hotel.



## 6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> September 2023

#### **New Plymouth THU 07**

This morning we take a drive out to one of New Plymouths most striking landmarks, Te Rewa Rewa Bridge is reminiscent of a breaking wave or a whale skeleton and on a clear day, the arches of the bridge frame Mount Taranaki spectacularly in the distance. For those who would like to stretch their legs this morning, take a walk back to **The Wind Wand**, along part of the Coastal Walkway which is a 4.5-km walk (approximately 55minutes). This expansive sea-edge promenade boasts dramatic views at each turn.

Time at leisure in the city centre has been allowed for. Whilst here you many want to visit the Len Lye Centre or Puke Ariki (own cost). If you are wanting to visit Puke Ariki, the highlights include the interactive boat experience of Reef Life! a walk-in replica pioneering hut from the early 1900s, and a captivating 12-minute multi-media theatre show that celebrates all things Taranaki. *Admission is free, although there may be a charge for* special exhibitions.

Later this afternoon we visit Pukekura Park, often described as the jewel in New Plymouth's crown. We stop here for a guided walk and buggy tour through the gardens which feature the iconic red Poet's Bridge, Fountain Lake, the Waterfall and Band Rotunda. After our guided tour we visit the Tea House on the Lake for a light Devonshire afternoon tea. Dinner tonight is at a local restaurant.

## New Plymouth – Stratford – Whangamomona – New Plymouth ® 🗓 D Today on head out of forms to come of the greatly assumption

Today we head out of town to some of the smaller communities of the region. Our first stop is at the closest main centre to **Egmont National Park**, Stratford. This is the gateway to Mount Taranaki, Dawson Falls, and the Forgotten World Highway. It is a vibrant farming community with a focus on dairy farming. We'll see the **Stratford Glockenspiel** which plays a delightfully romantic scene from Shakespeare's 'Romeo & Juliet'. Interestingly all streets in Stratford are named after Shakespearean plays and characters!

After our short visit to Stratford, we continue our travels through the small settlements of Toko, Douglas and Te Wera before arriving at famously known "Republic of Whangamomona". Upon arrival in Whangamomona, take time to stroll around the wee township, before heading to the charismatic pub, where we enjoy lunch together.

Heading back to Stratford, no journey is complete without a visit to **Taranaki Pioneer Village**. Here we take a nostalgic stroll through yesteryear as we go through their outdoor museum which presents the life of Taranaki pioneers in the 19th and 20th centuries. The village features 40 authentic historic structures dating back to 1853 and many exhibits and museum artifacts are in working condition.

After our visit here we head back to New Plymouth and dine at our hotel restaurant.

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This morning we say goodbye to New Plymouth as we travel to Hawera where we visit an impressive visual history of South Taranaki at the **Tawhiti Museum** is a truly unique enterprise.

The creation of artist Nigel Ogle, its attention to detail is simply stunning. Widely acclaimed as the best private museum in the country, the museum uses life size exhibits and scale models to present our heritage in a series of super realistic and engaging displays. All these displays are designed and built on the premises in the 'Body Shop' and accompanying studios, which can be viewed as part of a museum visit.

#### **SUN 10** Whanganui – Home




Our morning starts with a delicious breakfast at a local café, before we visit the exotic **Paloma Gardens**, which has four distinct areas with plants from the "jungles of Asia to the deserts of Africa and the Americas".

The first contains foliage, bamboos, palms, alocasias, ferns and cycads. The second has many species of cyads as well as Pachypodiums (related to frangipani) with different species flowering most of the year. The third area is on the north-facing hillside and features succulents, cacti, palm forest and a giant African Lobelia tree. Finally, there is the Paloma Arboretum, with extensive tree plantings. Paloma is classified as a Garden of National Significance.

After our visit, we depart Whanganui, crossing the Manawatu Plains, travelling south towards Kapiti. We hope you leave with many happy memories of your tour.
